Before his Cambridge appointment, he held an academic fellowship at the University of Oxford and, prior to that, a postdoctoral fellowship at the University of California-Berkeley. A Fulbright scholar, he received MSc degrees in mathematics and mathematics education, and then his PhD in mathematics education, at the University of Michigan. He was born and educated up to the undergraduate level in Cyprus. Since 2007 he has attended 7 CERME conferences (excluding the current one), has (co)authored 15 papers across 7 different TWGs, and has served on the leadership team of TWG22 which he helped establish.
